Obituary

Robert Joseph Coleman was born Monday, April 10, 1939, in Gadsden, Alabama to the union of Joseph James Coleman, a native of D'Lo, Simpson County, Mississippi and Beulah Mae Adkins, a native of Gadsden, Etowah County, Alabama.

Robert J. Coleman departed this life at 10:16 am, June 30, 2023, at home in Jackson, Mississippi with his eldest living child Meredith, his caregiver of 10 years, at his bedside.

He was his father's first born, and his mother's only biological child. He was his maternal grandparents' first grandchild. He was Cousin Bob, Bobby Joe, Big Bob, Bob, daddy, and father. He attended St. John Christian Methodist Church every Sunday; his grandparents were founding members. His mother served as a director of the youth choir. He played trumpet in a local jazz band. He was a star athlete at Carver High School. His mother, aunts, uncles, and cousin all attended Carver High School. The city converted the facility into a museum after integration.

He was versatile; he attended the school marching band practice in his football uniform. He served his country as a Marine. He obtained an athletic scholarship to Jackson State College (now Jackson State University); he was a vital part of his football team's defense as a linebacker known in high school as BIG M and in college as BIG BOB. Today, his high school accolades and class pictures are preserved in Central-Carver Legacy Museum on Walnut Street in Gadsden, Alabama.

He obtained a B.S. Degree from Jackson State College in Biology in 1960. Shortly afterwards, he married Hazel Janell Meredith, the sister of James Howard Meredith, an historical icon; four children were born to their union: Robert Joseph, Meredith Sealey, Evalyn Roxianna, and Willa Janelle. He married his present wife Catherine McKay of 41 years in 1981. One child Jozzlyn Janika Coleman was born to their union.

He was preceded in death by his grandfather Thomas Edward Adkins (1884-1963), a former butcher; his grandmother Eve Adkins (1897-1953), known effectively as Christmas Eve for having been born Christmas Eve; his father Joseph James Coleman (1916-1976); his mother Beulah Mae Adkins Coleman Sealey Thomas (1921-2017); his stepfather John W. Sealey (1914-1976); his stepfather Pleasant Thomas

Professionally Robert Coleman was a fundraiser for statewide Head Start programs. He was a political strategist and a trailblazer. He worked in the co-op movement in the 1970s during the War on Poverty campaign for STAR with activists such as Fannie Lou Hamer and Jesse Morris. He threw his hat in the ring for Congress in 1976 against US Congressman Thad Cochran. In the 1970s, he and his brother-in-law James H. Meredith formed a political group and mentored Jackson State University students including Louis Armstrong who was the first member to be elected to City government in Jackson, Mississippi (1985). He was a chess champion and a chess teacher.

Robert J. Coleman was formerly a chef, a pawn shop owner on the West End in Atlanta, Georgia, a NASA Plant Operator, a Fulton County, Georgia Lab Analysist... He is a published author of *Time And After Time Ahead* (TAATA). He was a bible scholar, a Christian Hebrew, and a Methodist evangelist.

He leaves to cherish his memories: his wife Catherine McKay Coleman (1946); his daughters Meredith Sealey Coleman McGee (1963-), Jackson, Mississippi; Evalyn Coleman (1965-), Lithonia, Georgia; Willa Janelle Coleman Ridgeway (1972-), Jackson, Mississippi; and Jozzlyn Janika Coleman (1985-), Alpharetta, Georgia; his siblings: Douglas (Jeanette) Coleman, Pittsburg, Pennsylvania; Brenda Coleman (Isaac) Talton; Percilla Coleman, both of Newport News, Virginia; and Persheil Coleman of Buffalo, New York; his grandchildren: Janelle James Williams Hill (Fayetteville, North Carolina, Jossrael Coleman Hall, Khadiya Spaeei-Aziz, Calla Ridgeway, of Jackson, Mississippi; Arthur Darren (Jamelia) Dozier, Lithonia, Georgia; Terrell Barry and Bianca Barry, Chicago, IL; his Aunt Margaret Adkins Herring Lightsey, Gadsden, Alabama, and his Aunt Lee Walker Adkins, Peoria, Arizona; his 10 great-grandchildren, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, grandnieces & nephews, and other relatives.






